Chair's Corner

The Central Committee would like to thank all those who attended our first Frederick Democratic Gala this past Wednesday at Springfield Manor in Thurmont. We could not have picked a more perfect evening. With all we have endured under Donald Trump in the past six months and with our star power special quest, Minnesota Senator Amy Klobuchar, the gala sold out by the middle of June. I think the enthusiastic response illustrates the growing importance of the Democratic Party in the county and the recognition that Frederick is crucial to Democratic victories across the state.

Evidence of the growing importance of the Frederick annual fundraising event was in the number of elected officials or potential candidates who were in the room: four of the eight gubernatorial hopefuls, five potential candidates for the 6th congressional district should John Delaney choose not to run, both Frederick City announced mayoral candidates, and eight of the nine candidates registered in the aldermanic race.

Also in attendance was the new chair of the Maryland Democratic Party, Kathleen Matthews. She outlined the

party's summer canvassing campaign of Resistance and Renewal that will reach out to fall-off voters and listen to their concerns. The Central Committee is participating in this campaign and plans to contact with some 4,500 people before Labor Day.

Also joining us was our dynamic, progressive and brilliant congressman from the 8th district, Jamie Raskin, along with Senator Chris Van Hollen, who drove our special quest from Capitol Hill. Van Hollen is a true champion of the American people, fighting every day to ensure that our state and our country live up to their full promise of equal rights, equal justice and equal opportunity. Since becoming senator six months ago, he has become a leading Democratic spokesman. He is everywhere. Most recently, he has been out in front arguing against attempts to overturn the Affordable Care Act. Even though the Republican Wealthcare Bill failed this time, he admonished those in attendance not to let their guard down. As he put it, "There is no time for a victory lap."

The highlight of the evening was the very thoughtful, hopeful, funny and timely remarks from Senator Klobuchar. Listed as one of twenty

potential Democratic presidential candidates in 2020, the senator focused on what the grassroots and the party have accomplished in "these first months of Trump," and citing her experience in Minnesota, she talked about the need to reach rural voters with Democratic messages.

Special congratulations to this year's awardees: Woman of the Year Judy Rice, Man of the Year Don DeArmon, and Volunteer of the Year Maureen Grayzeck. They have given much to the Democratic Party and to the Frederick community, and we thank them for their service. In recognition of the growing involvement of the younger generation and with a focus on "building our bench," this year we inaugurated a new award – The Rising Star. We were pleased to present this award to Kavonte Duckett.

Democrats in Disarray

This has been a headline topic throughout the media during the final week of June. Our losing streak was exasperated by the congressional special election in Georgia. In general, most Democrats are in agreement that we need to do something very different, but we are not aligned on what that is.

On a national basis, we have lost more than a 1000 state legislative seats, and we control only one-third of the country's legislative chambers. Maryland's own 2014 gubernatorial race should never have been lost. For years to come, pundits will be debating how such an unprepared, morally deficient, and emotionally unstable individual became our country's president.

Before we take corrective action, we must develop some consensus about our major challenges. What follows is a summary of several of the questions that have been frequently posed:

- Is our party out of touch with families who are struggling economically?
- Is there too much of a divide between the left and moderates?
- Do we have a compelling message that resonates with a plurality of the voters?
- Are we able to inspire enough voter turn out,

- particularly for state and local elections?
- Do we place enough emphasis on local elections, or do we concentrate much more heavily on the presidential cycle?
- Do we need major changes in our party's leadership?
- Are we appealing to younger voters?
- Are we aggressive enough? By always taking the high road, do we fail to defend ourselves?

I would submit that there is some truth in all of the above. So where do we begin? I believe that we need to start by building a broader coalition.

Less than a century ago, Democrats were able to unify some unlikely voting groups. During the mid-20th century, Northern progressives and Southern conservatives passed Social Security, Medicare, Medicaid, and the Civil Rights Act. Even as we lost some of those Southern conservatives, we were able to retain factory workers from the rust belt. This is no longer the case.

Unless we want to abdicate to more Trump policy supporters, we need to re-build a broader coalition. We must win back more moderates and working-class voters.

This will necessitate some compromise on ideology. We need to carefully select our most important issues and be willing to negotiate on others. If we insist on being "idiotically pure" (all or none), we will continue to lose Democratic seats in the General Assembly, the governor's mansion, Congress, and the presidency.

First, we must prioritize our most important issues within the context of healthcare, education, the environment, equality, and social justice. Next we must craft succinct messages with broad appeal that have a strong emotional connection with likely voters. (I intend to write more about this in a future *Banner* edition.) Finally, we must be bold and stop avoiding anything that appears to be controversial with respect to our

major issues. We need more spokespeople and champions!

The "wake-up call" has been blasting for several years. It is time for Democrats to stop hitting the snooze button!

A New Way to Communicate to Voters: The Frederick Democrats Podcast

It is with great pleasure and much anticipation that the Frederick County Democratic State Central Committee will be debuting the Frederick County Democrats Podcast on or before July 10! For Frederick County politics, this podcast is setting us a bar above the competition in terms of getting our message out to voters, especially millennial voters who often seek their political news through non-traditional media.

Let's face it, as Democrats, we haven't done at great job in recent years of getting our message out and explaining to voters why our party is the better and stronger choice to represent their interests. When it comes to local elections, it can sometimes be difficult for candidates to spread their message because they compete with major media outlets pushing the big stories of the day; and all too often local candidates are working with a limited campaign budget, a limited number of volunteers, having a regular job, and talking to media outlets that aren't keeping pace with how voters consume information. But we can and will do a better job moving forward. This podcast series will provide our candidates with the opportunity to reach a wide audience of voters, voters that can listen to the podcast when it is convenient to their own busy schedules.

What is great about a podcast is that they can be posted to social media and are downloadable, so voters can listen to them anywhere and at any time. Voters can even binge listen in the days leading up to an election.

With Frederick City elections taking place this fall, city voters will be able to hear from our candidates while commuting to work, completing house chores, or traveling to their vacation destinations this summer.

The first episodes of the podcast will feature members of the Frederick County Democratic Central Committee. In these episodes, we

explain what the Central Committee is and what it does. We discuss the various subcommittees and how Democrats within the community can volunteer as well as other ways to get involved. Following these episodes, I will be interviewing our Democratic candidates for aldermen and mayor. Through the Fred Dems Facebook page, we have asked city residents to provide us with questions they would like to ask the candidates. This has given us a good feel for what matters most to city voters.


