In just twelve days, voters in Frederick City will be going to the polls to select their Republican and Democratic choices to run the city for the next four years. In past elections, the Democratic primary has turned out a very small percentage of the city's registered voters. In fact, in 2013, only15.11% of registered Democrats bothered to make their voices heard. The challenge for us is to make sure that this time we get Democrats to the polls.

We have an impressive group of Democrats who have stepped forward to serve the residents of the city. Two candidates are running for mayor: Alderman Michael O'Connor and former Mayor Jennifer Dougherty. Ten Democrats are vying for the five aldermanic positions on the November 7 ballot: current Aldermen Kelly Russell and Donna Kuzemchak, along with Todd Anderson, Jeannette Bartelt, Antonio Bowens, Kris Fair, Ben McShane, Derek Shackelford, Kim Williams and Roger Wilson. Do you know whom vou will be voting for? Your candidates can use your help over



the next twelve days. In addition to the money they need to run competitive races, they also need volunteers to get out their message and make sure supporters get to the polls. Please consider helping one or more of these fine candidates.

September promises to be a very busy month. In addition to voting, there are fairs, festivals and fundraisers. We will have a table at tomorrow's First Saturday at the corner of Market and Patrick Streets. Stop by, and if you have taken the voter registration training, consider staying to register new voters. We also hope to see many of you at our booth at Frederick's annual In the Street festival, which takes place on September 9 from 11:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Note that is just three days before the primary election, and we expect to have all the candidates there. If you have some time, volunteer! The Great Frederick Fair will be held this year from Friday, September 15 to Saturday, September 23. We are working with the Women's Democratic League to make the Democratic tent an inviting place to visit.

I recently returned from the National Conference of State Legislators Summit. One of the highlights was a presentation by Doris Kearns Goodwin entitled "Some Lessons on Presidential Leadership."

"What a turbulent time it has been to be a presidential historian," Goodwin said during the closing session. On a day when the world was on edge over the exchange of sharp language between the leader of North Korea and the President, Goodwin said there were plenty of lessons we can draw from history.

"We have never quite seen a president like Mr. Trump," she said, "but the anger and fear has echoes in the past," such as the industrial revolution, the tide of immigrants in the early 20th century, and the wealth inequity of the Gilded Age.

One way to compare past leaders to Trump, she said, was to look at some of the traits that great past presidents shared. Referring to Abraham Lincoln, Teddy Roosevelt and Franklin Roosevelt, she pointed to these qualities:

- Each discovered he had the potential for leadership.
- They were resilient.
- They had the confidence to surround themselves with people who disagreed with them.
- They learned from their mistakes.

- They could control their impulses.
- They knew how to relax and shake off their anxieties.

Lincoln, Teddy Roosevelt, and FDR first ran for office in their twenties.

They experienced frustration, even despair, such as when Teddy Roosevelt saw both his first wife and mother die on the same day. "All leaders must develop a resilience to cope with trials by fire," Goodwin said. "Like all leaders, [Trump] will experience reversals and adversity. The real test is not how he responds to winning but to adversity."

She pointed to Lincoln's cabinet, which she chronicled in *Team of Rivals*, as the ultimate example of surrounding yourself with people who might disagree. Lincoln said he needed the "strongest and most able" people to help him run the country.

Goodwin said she was heartened to see several of Trump's cabinet appointees disagree with him during their confirmation hearings. Trump "seemed to be open to a strong foreign policy team and he's shown a willingness to change his mind on policy issues." The "chilling worry," she said, was whether his recent remarks on North Korea were vetted with his cabinet or just a spontaneous comment.

She was less sure of Trump's capacity to learn from his mistakes. "The question remains: Is his temperament suited to self-reflection? There's not much evidence so far of that humility."

Her one concrete piece of advice for the current president was drawn from Lincoln's experience. He had a habit of writing letters expressing frustration and anger only to put them aside and sometimes never send them at all. One such letter was to General George Meade after the battle of Gettysburg. Lincoln was incensed that he'd failed to pursue Robert E. Lee's army and end the Civil War. Taking a page from Lincoln, she said, "President Trump could set up two Twitter accounts, one real and one fake." He could use the fake one, she suggested, "to get the anger out of his system." ###



Central Committee hosts City Forum

In its continuing efforts to support its candidates and keep party voters informed, the Frederick County Democratic State Central Committee hosted an aldermanic and mayoral primary forum on Thursday, August 10, 2017 at the Community Room of C. Burr Artz Library in downtown Frederick. The forum attracted approximately 100 voters. All ten aldermanic candidates attended, as did both mayoral hopefuls.

The forum lasted three hours. Questions developed by the Campaign and Strategy Committee, as well as those forwarded by party members online, were posed to the candidates by Central Committee member Bob Kresslein. The aldermanic candidates held sway during the first 90 minutes, with the mayoral candidates following for an hour.

The issues included the balancing of historic preservation with economic development; visions for the Westside Park on the Hargett Farm; dealing with the opioid crisis and homelessness; taxes and city services; bulk trash pick-up and methods of increasing voter participation in city elections. Finally, the mayoral candidates were asked whether they would pledge their support to whomever is successful in the upcoming primary and urge their supporters to do the same. We are happy to report that both Jennifer Dougherty and Michael O'Connor unhesitatingly agreed to do so. ###
