Happy Summer! We're getting the season off to a great start with our first in-person gala since 2019 coming up on June 6, and we're looking forward to seeing many of you at Dutch's Daughter that night to hear from Senator Chris Van Hollen. If you bought tickets, please be ready to show proof of a recent negative COVID test; home tests will also be available outside for anyone who wants to double-check.

May was certainly busy, with candidate kickoffs, fundraisers, our first Monocacy Plowman and Fisherman event, and the Western Maryland Democratic Summit. Our second Plow-Fish, with Anthony Brown, has been postponed to a date yet to be determined, but he was kind enough to do a Zoom preview for us, which was open to all. If you still want to become a Plow-Fish member and attend the two remaining events later this year, you can join here. It's \$120 for the remainder of 2020, or \$110 if you're already a monthly sustainer, and every dollar stays in Frederick County to help get local Democrats elected.

The primary season is well underway, with candidate signs popping up on lawns across the county. We're getting a lot of confused visitors to our office and website, asking what districts they're in now. A lot may have changed for you, too, since 2018. This year, you'll be voting for your County Council member in one of five districts; for your legislators in Annapolis in one of three districts; and for your congressman - which now for all of Frederick County is district 6, currently held by David Trone. It's a lot to remember. Please reach out if you have any questions about who the choices are on your ballot. There are so many different combinations that the sample ballots on the state Board of Elections website run to 498 pages! (The Democratic ballots start on p. 167 if you want to sneak a peek.)

We all need to work between now and November to make sure our nominees are

successful up and down the ballot. If you haven't requested your mailin ballot yet, the form you need is at https:// elections.maryland.gov/ voting/absentee.html

- and you can request mail-in ballots for all future elections at the same time. Again I urge you to make sure your unaffiliated friends know that they can also vote in the Board of Education primary, and make sure they know which candidates to support.
Eight of the current 16



BoE candidates will make it past the July 19 primary, and four of those will be elected in the general. If we can get all six of the sane candidates through the primary, that leaves just two of the scary ones to defeat in November.

We have plenty of signs and informational materials at our office, too, in case you need anything to help promote your favorite candidates in any race. If you've never been out to see us, we're at 1080 West Patrick, suite 4 (in the corner next to ALDI). Our current hours are Mondays 3:00-7:00, Wednesdays 2:00-8:00, and Saturdays 10:00-2:00. We'd love to be open longer and more often, but we need your help. If you came out and volunteered to staff the office in 2018 or 2020, please come back! Amazingly, I write to you following my first six months as one of your Democratic members of the Board of Aldermen. Wait, all of your City of Frederick officials are Democrats . . . because the Democratic Party is strong in Frederick County and we are building for November . . . but I digress.

I've been granted this amazing opportunity to serve for four years so that means that an eighth of my time to "get stuff done" has already passed. I'll confess that I immediately fall into thinking: "Ahhhh, I'm not doing enough!" "I'm not getting enough done!" "We need to do more!" Fellow Moms know a little bit about this feeling.

Yet, we just crossed a major item off of our yearly "to-do list". The past three months have been all about budget. The City's budget establishes our plan for the next year, beginning in July, and involves a host of public meetings, healthy discussion, and input from various stakeholders. This year we held 11 public budget meetings in addition to our other regular public meetings. If you recall, I wrote about our shared experience presenting at a December budget presentation. Preparation for the FY24 budget, in fact, begins now.

When I ponder the last six months, I can emphatically say that our biggest accomplishment is that the Frederick City Budget has been approved! My colleagues and I worked hard to pass a "Working Families Budget". From park improvements to stay healthy to two new community centers for families to gather to our advocacy to move the City toward a living

wage to an initial investment to launch a Green Bank - this budget continued to lift up the values we hold so dear.

Now, we will shift to introducing, debating, and ultimately passing policy solutions related to equity, housing, climate, and transportation - just to name a few. I intend to champion a robust policy agenda that matches the work we started in this year's budget cycle. Yet, as I have repeatedly said, we must work to bring new voices to the conversation. Our work is only valuable if it is inclusive.

I'll share a story about one of these new voices. Josh and I met Netasha at her door on the campaign trail. Netasha is a mom, federal employee, and eager to get more involved in her community - she specifically would like to see additional recreation avenues for our City youth. Netasha met with me and we brainstormed several solutions to move forward. We also toured City Hall and we discussed ways Netasha (and her network) could plug into local government and ways that local government could be more present in her network.

It isn't enough that we sit in our offices in City Hall - we have got to share information, build neighborhood power, and ensure that today's neighborhood advocate is tomorrow's Democratic leader.



THE IMPORTANCE OF THIS YEAR'S BOE ELECTION

Every election is important, and this year has the importance of electing the right people to the BOE. I do have to state upfront that I have been a Social Studies teacher for FCPS for 22 years. During that time, I have taught the curriculum for American Government, U.S. History, World History, as well as Psychology. I believe in my job as a teacher and feel that the job of educating our youth is the highest of importance.

This being the case, it is worth looking at the importance of the BOE. According to Robert Hull, President, and CEO of the National Association of State Board of Education,

"Boards of education are among the last bastions of civil discourse in the country. By and large board members engage in complex discussions about policy without a lot of partisan drama."

That is the way it is supposed to be. "No partisan drama". The reality is partisan drama has inserted itself into the BOE race. Individuals running this year have taken their marching orders from MAGA-style politicians. In the Republican Party. The education, not indoctrination slogan of certain candidates running for the BOE as a group sounds like it came directly from the Republican platform. The obsessive focus on CRT, Elementary health Education, as well as attempts to ban certain books based on no clear purpose than following a policy of hatred and prejudice toward ideas that are different than what they accept. So, this begs the question. What is the BOE supposed to do? From reading lots of literature on the duties of the BOE, I think I can sum up the duties with seven basic ideas.

- 1. Hiring and evaluating the superintendent.
- 2. Adopting district policies.

- 3. Adoption and monitor budget.
- 4. Actively listening to public comments.
- 5. Making student achievement a priority.
- 6. Advocating on important k-12 policy.
- 7. Ensuring accountability for student and district performance.

Individuals that will carry out their job responsibilities without getting bogged down in partisan politics. Fox News used to claim as their slogan "Fair and Balanced". That is exactly what you will get with FCTA/MSEA approved candidates, and our two other great Democrat candidates These candidates have been interviewed and vetted for their knowledge of educational issues. One of the key jobs of the BOE is to listen to the community. There is a key difference between listening to the community and caving in on every politicized motivated whim of the community. As has become evident this year, there is a very vocal minority in the Fredrick County community that wants to push the BOE to carry out their ideas no matter how out of control or out of line their ideas are. THE "CRAZIES" ARE AMONGST US: PART I

The traditional Republican Party used to stand for principles like a balanced budget, support for national defense, and conservative social policies. The Reagan Republican Party that has morphed into the Trump Insurrection Republican Party now repeats the Reagan mantra of "reduce taxes,", especially on the rich but adds to those bogus complaints about a stolen election, the "fake media" and conspiracy theories. Tim Rowland, a columnist for The Herald Mail, nailed it in a recent column when he said, in reference to loony Congresswoman Marjorie Taylor Green, "You put modern-day Republicans under oath and they suddenly lose their memories... A cadre of Georgia voters are [sic] trying to disqualify Greene from running for office on the grounds of being a traitor. They won't win, but the testimony has revealed a new truth about today's Republicans: Lying doesn't matter." On bogus fraud claims, Rowland says: "With tragicomic results for the nation as a whole, the radical wing of the GOP keeps catching itself in traps it sets for others. Having made a big stink about voter fraud, the fraudsters are finally being caught - and what do you know, the offenders are Republicans. And recall Project Veritas, which tried to use hidden microphones to cause embarrassing moments for Democrats - until its own operatives were caught knee-deep in lies on a camera hidden by reporters for The Washington Post." When House Minority Leader was caught lying about his attempt to persuade President Trump to resign after the January 6 insurrection attempt, McCarthy, according to Rowland, "explained (to the Republican caucus) that he lied because he felt a lie was called for - and received a



standing ovation."

McCarthy and Green are but two examples of the radicalization and disintegration of the Republican Party into a party that deserves no respect and support. Take for example Maryland's lone Republican congressman, Andy Harris. Harris, a former strong supporter of term limits, who more than a decade ago pleaded to serve no more than six terms, is now seeking his seventh term in the United States House of Representatives. Congressman Harris is the poster child for extremism. The Baltimore Sun described him as "a fellow traveler of GOP wing-nuts" known for his hypocrisy. For example, when first elected to Congress he complained that he had to wait 30 days to be covered by his federal health insurance despite the fact that he was a strong opponent of the Affordable Care Act and later voted to repeal it many times. In his campaign for re-election, he is touting a federal-funded environmental project for the Chesapeake Bay that he voted against. He was one of only sixteen House Republicans to vote against a bill directing the National Park Service to include in its educational materials the history of the internment of Japanese Americans during World War II. He joined 62 other Republicans in voting against a resolution affirming support for NATO. He was part of a group of Republicans in the House who blocked the naming of a federal courthouse in Tallahassee after a respected African American jurist. An anesthesiologist, has had a complaint filed against him for prescribing ivermectin, a medication typically used to treat parasites in livestock and humans, to treat

COVID-19 even though it has not been authorized for treating COVID-19 by the Food and Drug Administration. He has been very vocal in opposing vaccine and mask mandates. He calls it coercion but is strongly in favor of the government exercising coercion in regard to women's reproductive freedom. When the U.S. House of Representatives voted to remove a bust of Supreme Court Chief Justice Roger Taney from the Capitol, Harris was the lone dissenter in the Maryland delegation, along with 119 other Republican members (67 Republicans voted with the Democrats to remove the bust). Harris joined Congresswoman Marjorie Taylor Greene and nine other Republican members in opposing a resolution honoring police officers who defended the U.S. House against the January 6 insurrectionists. They objected to the use of the word "insurrection" in the resolution. He also voted against a package that increased resources for the Capitol Police, made physical security-related upgrades, boosted salaries for custodial staff, and allocated funds for a Capitol rapid response team. You can't make this stuff up! Of course, he was among the Republicans in Congress who voted against certifying the election of President Biden and Vice-President Harris. He has refused to honor Capitol Police for their heroism on January 6th, tried to stop the reauthorization of the Violence Against Women Act, objected to stronger child abuse laws, voted against equal rights for women, stood against a path to citizenship for Dreamers, supported the military coup in Myanmar, and has attempted to cut Medicare and Medicaid. His most recent extremist vote occurred when he was one of only 17 members of Congress to vote against a resolution supporting Moldova (H.R. 833). Just last week he spoke to a conservative conference in Hungary where he stated that children "are coming under increasing attack by left-leaning educational and political indoctrination," and he applauded Hungary, governed by authoritarian Prime Minister Viktor Orban, for "strategically" avoiding war, inflation, and "cultural, moral and even intellectual decline."

When Governor Hogan recently spoke at the Ronald Reagan Presidential Foundation and Institute he called the attack on the Capital "an outrageous attack on our Democracy, incited by the losing candidate's inflammatory false rhetoric," and he called for the Republican Party to offer "a hopeful positive vision for America and a message that appeals to a broader group of voters." He urged voters to stand against extremes. Harris will face

strong Democratic opposition in the general election in a Republican-leaning district. Hopefully, the voters of the First Congressional District will come to their senses and reject Republican extremism.

In future columns, I will discuss Republican extremism in Frederick County.





Judge of Orphan's Court

Since a judge of the Orphans' Court needs to maintain a position of non-partisanship, I believe the role of a judge in the Orphans' Court is to ensure that all parties are heard and are treated with dignity and respect. I will work with the litigants to move the cases forward expeditiously and within the bounds of the law. Every party should have the opportunity to be heard and have their case decided fairly, based upon the evidence.

My legal background is an asset for this position. A judge of this Court needs to adjudicate and ensure the Court is operationally effective. It is important, therefore, to determine legislative intent and interpret the laws within the appellate court's parameters. If a case before the court presents new issues, then the Court's decision should be founded on the spirit and letter of the law.
