CHAIR'S CORNER

Whew! Another gubernatorial election season is now in the books. If you haven't heard, Jessica Fitzwater is now our County Executive-elect. That was a nail-biter race and kept everyone on edge. Thankfully, she prevailed. The new soon-to-be council includes incumbents Jerry Donald, district 1, and M.C. Keegan-Ayer, district 3, plus council newcomers Kavonte Duckett representing Jessica's former council, district 4, and our two at-large members Renee Knapp and Brad Young, who formerly served on the Board of Education.

In the Board of Education race, three of the "Students First" Slate, comprised of four Democratic candidates, were elected, specifically incumbent Karen Yoho and candidates Rae Gallagher and Dean Rose. On the state level in legislative district 3, Delegate Karen Lewis Young is our Senator-elect, incumbent Delegate Ken Kerr retains his seat, and newcomers Kris Fair and Karen Simpson round out the other two delegate seats. Last but not least, incumbent Orphans' Court Judge Bonnie Nicholson was re-elected, and we added one seat to that bench with the election of Michael Powell.

We are delighted that 15 of our local Democratic candidates had victorious outcomes but saddened that the remaining ones did not. They all put in valiant efforts and would have served Frederick County well. We extend our appreciation and will not forget their efforts and impact.

At the top of the ticket, Marylanders chose Democratic incumbents U.S. Senator Chris Van Hollen and Congressman David Trone, and Democratic candidates Wes Moore and Aruna Miller as our Governor and Lt. Governor-elects, Comptroller-elect Brooke Lierman and Attorney General-elect Anthony Brown.

While candidates are heavily visible front and center during election cycles, you may not know all the work your Frederick County Democratic Central Committee (FCDCC) is doing in the community on front and backlines. If you're unfamiliar with the FCDCC, in a nutshell, Central Committee members are elected volunteers who work to build the Democratic Party in Frederick County, raise awareness of Party principles and positions, and help get qualified Democratic candidates elected. You can learn more about the role we play here.

We'll soon take time to analyze what did or didn't work and make any tweaks necessary, so we're ahead of the curve for future elections, but here's a rundown of all we accomplished this year.

Thoughts on the 2022 election in Frederick County

The 2022 election is history and, as Democrats, we can take pride in the results in Frederick County. My son Stephen and I have prepared a preliminary analysis of the results but still need to dig deeper into the precinct-by-precinct results to complete our analysis. Any group who would like to hear about our analysis should contact Stephen or me. This column will only touch the surface of that analysis. Democrats in Frederick County are enthusiastic that Jessica Fitzwater was able to defeat Michael Hough for County Executive and that we will hold five of the seven Council seats. We also are pleased that we kept Senate and House District 3 blue and captured three of the four Board of Education slots. The fact that we gained an additional Orphans' Court judge is evidence that the future looks good for further inroads into the county offices. Congratulations to all those who won. Special thanks to those who put their names on the ballot, in some instances where the odds were very much uphill, including Shawn Perry, Carleah Summers, Andrew Duck, Brandon Duck, Millicent Hall, Lisa Jarosinski, Julianna Lufkin, Megan LeRoux, Chris Manners, Marvin Schwab, Karl Bickel, and Ysela Bravo.

Congressman David Trone was able to gain re-election with his strong showing in Frederick and Montgomery Counties and, I believe for the first time in recent memory, all of the Democratic statewide candidates (Moore-Miller, Lierman, Brown, and Van Hollen) carried Frederick County.

At first I had my doubts. Not being a nightowl, I went to bed without any numbers to consider but woke up at 3:00 a.m. and immediately looked at my phone to see the results that had been posted. I was heartbroken seeing that Trone had lost, Jessica had lost, Bonnie had lost as well as all of our Council candidates except M.C. and Kavonte. It took me a bit to realize that only the early votes and same-day votes had been counted, but I was still very discouraged at first. Thanks to Kai Hagen for never giving up hope, especially in regard to the County Executive race, as he painstakingly posted the mail-in and provisional ballots on Facebook as they came in. Stephen Slater posted in our analysis the slow but sure march of Jessica to victory:

Compare to the election four years ago, when Larry Hogan carried Frederick County 67.67% to Ben Jealous's 31.11%, and David Trone received 60% to Amie Hoeber's 36% in Frederick County. Jan Gardner defeated Kathy Afzali for County Executive by a 52% to 43% (Earl Robbins, running as an independent received 5%). Kai Hagen finished first for at-large Council, Phil Dacey finished second, and our other Democratic nominee, Susan Reeder Jessee, finished fourth. Jerry Donald won his council race by just 345 votes. Four years ago, the Democratic candidates lost the county offices of Sheriff, Register of Wills, and Clerk of the Court, but all lost by larger margins than this year.

The efforts of the Democratic State Central Committee and the many volunteers who worked in this campaign are more fully delineated in the Chair's column in this issue of the Banner.

The victory of Bonnie Nicholson and Mike Powell as Orphans' Court judges is the first time that two Democrats have been elected as Orphans' Court Judges since 1994, when Democrats John Crum and Dorsey Shipley were elected. Tim May, a Republican, was the third Orphans' Judge elected in 1994. From 1974 until 1994, only Democrats had been elected to the Orphans' Court except for Republican Helen Swanson in 1978.

Democrats mourn the recent losses of Leo Boyle, Shelia Hixon and Paul Weisengoff. Leo Boyle was a lifelong Democratic loyalist from Emmitsburg who was very active in the Vigilant Hose Company and was appointed by four Maryland Democratic Governors to terms on the Frederick County Liquor Board. He was 88. Shelia Hixon served longer in the Maryland House of Delegates than any other woman (from 1976 until 2018 – 42 years) and was the first woman to chair the House Ways and Means Committee. She was 89. Paul Weisengoff was an educator and lobbyist from Baltimore City who served 27 years as a member of the House of Delegates. He also was 89.


