We're excited to announce that Colmon Elridge will be the keynote speaker at our annual Frederick County Democratic Gala on Monday, 12 June! Colmon, Chair of the Kentucky Democratic Party and Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Officer for the DNC Rural Council, has been a leader in Kentucky and national politics and governing for over a decade. Coming from humble beginnings, Colmon broke the cycle of poverty through hard work, education, and opportunities afforded to him through the Democratic Party. He has served as the Outreach Director for the Kentucky Democratic Party, served two terms as the Executive Vice President of the Young Democrats of America, and served for eight years as the Executive Assistant and Senior Advisor to Kentucky's 61st Governor. Colmon is the first African American to serve as the Chair of the Kentucky Democratic Party.

Just as shocking was learning that Chuck knew of this investigation before the elections last year and didn't mention it. For the following nine days after the indictment, the Sheriff continued to go about his daily work despite the fact that other Frederick County Sheriff's Office employees are immediately

placed on administrative leave when criminal charges are levied. We learned that Council Vice President Kavonte Duckett issued a statement asking for the Sheriff to go on leave, and the members of the Democratic Central Committee felt strongly that we should do the same, which we released on 7 April. We were glad that the Sheriff placed himself on leave as of the end of business on 14 April because it was the right thing to do.


