The Rest of the Story – Honoring Beverly Butcher Byron

As you will note elsewhere in this month's issue of the Banner, the Democratic State Central Committee for Frederick County has decided to create the Beverly B. Byron Award. The first recipient of the award, Beverly B. Byron, will receive this award at an event to be held at the Frederick Elks on November 27. A fairly new member of the Central Committee asked at a recent meeting, "Who is Beverly Byron that we are honoring?" Let me set the record straight.

Beverly Butcher was born in Baltimore, Maryland on July 27, 1932. She attended Hood College and married a young Frederick lawyer with a political pedigree, Goodloe E. Byron. Both Goodloe's mother and father had served in Congress. His father, William Byron, from Williamsport in Washington County, represented the 6<sup>th</sup> Congressional District of Maryland from January 3, 1939 until February 27, 1941, when he was killed in an airplane crash in Georgia. His wife, Katharine Byron, was chosen to represent her husband in Congress in a special election held on May 27, 1941 and did not seek re-election. She was the first female to represent Maryland in the U.S. Congress.

Beverly's family had political connections as well. Her father, Harry Butcher, was involved with CBS radio and coined the phrase "Fireside chat" to refer to FDR's radio addresses to the nation. Butcher became a close friend of Dwight Eisenhower and served as Eisenhower's naval aide during World War II. While Harry Butcher and Dwight Eisenhower were in London at the beginning of the war, Beverly and her mother shared an apartment with Mamie and John Eisenhower, thus beginning a long association with the Eisenhowers. Beverly can tell some stories about her experiences during and after the war with FDR and Eleanor, Harry Hopkins, and Dwight and Mamie.

After marrying Goodloe, Beverly became very much involved with the Young Democrats of Maryland and of Frederick County. Goodloe was the president of the Maryland Young Democrats and was elected to the Maryland House of Delegates and then the Maryland Senate representing Frederick County. They also became the parents of three children, Goodloe, Jr., Kimball, and Mary. Beverly was an essential ingredient of all of Goodloe's campaigns for political office. He ran unsuccessfully for the U.S. House of Representatives to represent the 6th C.D. in 1968 but was elected to the U.S. House of Representatives in 1970, defeating Maryland Senator George Hughes. Goodloe established a generally conservative voting record in Congress, back when both parties elected people that represented a wide range of views. Goodloe was known for his involvement of young people in his campaigns and for encouraging young people to run for office, including Galen Clagett and Ron Young. Tragedy struck the Byron family again in 1978 after Goodloe had won the Democratic primary for another term in Congress, when Goodloe, age 49, died suddenly of a heart attack while jogging on the C&O canal with his aide Brent Ayer, husband of

Frederick Councilwoman M.C. Keegan-Ayer. Acting Governor Blair Lee, II called Beverly and urged her to request that the Democratic State Central Committee of Maryland put her name up for nomination for the Congressional seat. The local Democratic State Central Committee, of which I was a member, visited Beverly at her house and also urged her to accept the nomination. She was nominated and easily won the election to represent the 6<sup>th</sup> C.D. of Maryland in 1978. She represented Western Maryland in the U.S. Congress until 1992 when she was upset in the Democratic primary election by Frederick County Maryland House of Delegates member Tom Hattery. Beverly Byron had won re-election in 1990 with 75% of the vote.

While in Congress Beverly had one of the most conservative voting records for Democrats in Congress. She was very supportive of the military and served on the House Armed Services Committee where she was the first woman to chair a subcommittee and the first woman to ever fly aboard the SR-71 Blackbird of the USAF. She also was an advocate for fiscal responsibility and a balanced budget. The 1982 Politics in America said that "when Democratic leaders issue an appeal for party loyalty on a close vote in the House, she is a little more likely to go along than he (Goodloe) was." She also served on the Interior Committee and was a strong supporter of the national park system, physical fitness, and the building of hiking trails. She was known for her constituent service, town meetings, and for sending out surveys to sample the views of the voters in the district. During some of the time that Beverly served in Congress, I was chair of the Democratic State Central Committee, and she could always be counted on to bring good speakers to our Democratic dinners including Mo Udall and Claude Pepper. Recently I was at a fund-raiser for Ohio Senator Sherrod Brown in Potomac, and I was introduced to former Connecticut Congressman

Bruce Morrison by former Maryland Congressman Tom McMillen, who both served in Congress with Beverly. Morrison said that he remembered her as someone whose word you could always count on.

Her defeat in the 1990 primary was a result of the more liberal wing of the party objecting to her voting record. It also was a part of an anti-incumbent movement. Frasier Smith, in his compelling and fascinating book, William Donald Schaefer: A Political Biography, describes Schaefer going from receiving a record 82% in the 1986 general election to dropping down to 60% in 1990 against a littleknown and tacky husband and wife team for governor and lieutenant governor (Bill and Lois Shepard) said it was: a "time in American politics when incumbents were, by definition, the problem. Voters were gleefully repudiating lifetimes of public service as mere careerism. The usual records of accomplishments ... had become proof of unworthiness in the mind of the voter circa 1990." That sentiment was probably true in 1992 and contributed to Congresswoman Byron's defeat. Fellow Democrat Tom McMillen also went down to defeat in the general election in 1992. In politics sometimes voters should be warned to be careful about what they wish for, as young liberal Tom Hattery's smashing defeat of the more conservative Beverly Byron in the primary (Hattery carried every county and won the district 56% to 44%) resulted in the general election defeat of Hattery by the ultra-conservative Republican Roscoe Bartlett 54% to 46%. The voters of the 6<sup>th</sup> congressional district were stuck with Bartlett until he was defeated in 2012 by Democrat John Delaney after redistricting added a large portion of liberal Montgomery County to the district.

After leaving Congress, Beverly has served on the Base Realignment and Closure Commission, was on the Board of Visitors of the U.S. Navy Academy (chair from 1998-2003), was on the Board of Regents for the Potomac Institute for Policy Studies as well as numerous corporate boards. She has particularly enjoyed mentoring women in politics and watching her grandchildren grow to be, among other things, influential political organizers and operatives, attorneys, successful NASCAR drivers, and noted artists. At age 91 she commutes between her condo in Washington, DC, and her home in Frederick, reads the Washington Post every day, and is still a force to be reckoned with in politics.

The Democratic National Committee held its Fall Meeting in St Louis, Missouri October 4-7 2023 In addition to the general sessions, I attended the Eastern Regional Caucus Meeting and Small Business Council and Rural Council meetings

#### Summary from the Fall 2023 Meeting:

Here is a brief summary of the business and activities that took place during our meeting:

Election to Fill At-Large and Executive Committee Vacancies - The DNC elected Yvette Lewis of Maryland as an At-Large Member and Christale Spain of South Carolina to the DNC's Executive Committee.

Standing Committee Appointments - The DNC also approved the appointments of Budget & Finance Committee Co-Chair Christopher Lowe of New York and Jack Dulworth of Kentucky as a member of the committee. Credentials Co-Chair Hilda Solis of California and Trish Ruiz of New Mexico were approved to serve on the committee. Barry Goodman of Michigan and Sonja Witten of Nevada were approved to serve on the Resolutions Committee. Finally, the DNC approved the appointments of Carol Ronen of Illinois and Yvette Lewis of Maryland to serve on the Rules & Bylaws Committee.

Adoption of the Report of the DNC Rules & Bylaws Committee - The DNC adopted the Rules & Bylaws Committee report presented by Co-Chair James Roosevelt, Jr.

Adoption of the Report from the DNC Resolutions Committee - During the General Session, the membership adopted the Report of the Resolutions Committee, presented by Sandy Opstvedt, which included the adoption of 55 resolutions and are a combination of messaging and commemorative statements. Adoption of the Report from the DNC Credentials Committee - The membership also adopted the Report of the Credentials Committee presented by Daryl Newman

Finance & Treasurer Updates - National Finance Chair Chris Korge and Treasurer Virginia McGregor provided an update during both the Executive Committee meeting and the General Session on the party's finances. This year, the DNC has invested \$1.5 million into the Virginia legislative races in addition to significant support for other statewide and special elections. The DNC and the Biden-Harris campaign also raised \$72 million at the end of the second quarter, which will help the party establish the biggest war chest in the history of the Democratic Party.

Executive Committee Recap - The DNC Executive Committee met and heard a welcome from former Congressman Russ Carnahan, updates from DNC officers, remarks from DNC Vice Chair Governor Gretchen Whitmer, an update on the 2024 Convention from Democratic National Convention Committee Chair Minyon Moore and Executive Director Alex Hornbrook, an update from the Rules & Bylaws Committee Co-Chairs, James Roosevelt and Minyon Moore, as well as presentation on the Virginia legislative races from DNC Interim Director of Strategic Planning Libby Schneider and and Virginia Democratic Party Executive Director Shyam Raman

General Session - During the General Session, we shared an inspiring video about Democratic accomplishments, which you can find here

Support for UAW Strikers. Following the Friday Sessions, DNC members bussed to a local GM Plant in Wentzville, Missouri and joined the picket line in solidarity with union members. On Saturday UAW Local 2250 President Katie Deatherage addressed members about the sacrifices that union members made during the great recession and again in the pandemic to keep the industry afloat juxtaposing the post recession profits of the Big 3 management with the plight of its workers
