We once again thank Senator Karen Lewis Young and Ron Young for hosting our last Plow-Fish and Special Guest Senator William C. Smith Jr., for sharing about his family, insight on the Senate Judiciary Committee, and answering guests' questions.

The DSCC was also one of the cohosts of a Meet & Greet for the Democratic Congressional District 6 candidates on Saturday, 18 November. Nine of the ten candidates attended; unfortunately, one could not due to health reasons. Unfortunately, the Central Committee members also couldn't attend due to attending the Maryland Democratic Party meeting. Still, we heard it was informative, and about 100 people came to hear from the candidates. We thank United Democrats Club President Maureen Grayzeck for emceeing that day and ensuring the event flowed on time, and our other local Democratic Club leaders for assisting with food and beverages and planning support.

In 2024, we intend to host a candidate forum for the Senate candidates and a separate one for the Congressional District 6 candidates. Planning is underway for both events. We will provide details soon after the filing deadline on 9 February.

As I mentioned a moment ago, Central Committee members and Committee members of all other Maryland counties and Baltimore City met on 18 November at the State Party meeting. One of our functions was to elect a new Party Chair and 1st Vice Chair. When all the votes were tabulated, Ken Ulman was elected as our new chair and Dr. Charlene Dukes as 1st vice chair. We look forward to their leadership and what all DCCs can accomplish in our communities and across the state.

Earlier this week, we honored Beverly Byron as the first recipient of the newly created Beverly Byron Award. We had approximately 100 in attendance, and we all had the opportunity to hear several of Beverly's stories in response to Tom Slater's "A Trip Down Memory Lane" -style live interview. You could hear laughter in response to many of her stories throughout the evening. Beverly is one of many women trailblazers in Frederick County; she continues to be a force to be reckoned with today. We appreciate her years of dedicated work before, during, and after her terms in Congress, her tenacity, and her ongoing role in empowering women to run for office.

Continuing with my theme of thanks -My thanks also extend to our financial sponsors and contributors. Passages: Young, Old, and From the Past

Deaths are inevitable. Some live to a ripe old age and some die young. Whether old or young, memories are forever. The Democratic Party, this past month and not too far in the past, has experienced some losses.

Kristin Brown passed before she could reach her full potential. She was an active member of the UDFC, Women's Democratic League, and the Young Democrats of Frederick County. I didn't know Kristin, but those who did remember her for her honesty, work ethic, wisdom, intelligence, and entrepreneurship. She did not have the opportunity to do all the things I'm sure she wanted to do. She will be missed.

Rosalynn Carter lived a full, eventful life. Some said she was the most impactful First Lady after Eleanor Roosevelt. Her support for mental health treatment, improvements in

elder care, and the Equal Rights Amendment were legendary. She was married to Jimmy Carter for 77 years and died at age 96. She professed not to like politics, but once she became involved in her husband's campaign, she became his closest advisor and grew to love the ebb and flow of politics. She was said to be more upset about Jimmy's loss to Ronald Regan than Jimmy was in 1980. Her post-White House career was just as eventful as President Carter's as she joined him as he traveled around the world working for peace and helping with Habitat for Humanity. Despite being citizens of the world, she and Jimmy were most proud of being citizens of Plains, Georgia.

When I was helping plan for the recent Beverly Byron Award event, I sent an invitation to Steve Crawford. His wife, Liliane, left a message at my office that Steve had passed. I was shocked because I had not heard of his passing. Steve Crawford was an important clog in the Democratic Party in the 1990s in Frederick County. He was 80 when he died suddenly of a heart attack and stroke after a fall last May. He and his wife had moved from Frederick County to Montgomery County to be closer to his work. Trained as an economic sociologist with a B.A. from Cornell University, an M.G.A. from the Wharton Business School of the University of Pennsylvania, and a Ph.D. from Columbia University, Steve and Liliane moved to Frederick because he was teaching at the University of Maryland and she, who also earned a doctorate, was teaching at Gettysburg College.

Immediately immersing himself in the political culture of Frederick in 1994, Steve ran for the Democratic nomination to run against Roscoe Bartlett, who had defeated Democrat Tom Hattery in 1992 after Hattery had defeated incumbent Beverly Byron in the Democratic primary. Facing Crawford in the Democratic primary were Paul Muldowney, from Washington County, Neil Dhillon, from Allegany County and Galen Clagett, Don DeArmon and Cliff Snyder from Frederick County. Muldowney won the primary with 30% followed by Dhillon (18%), Crawford (18%), Clagett (17%), DeArmon (6%) and Snyder (6%). Muldowney was defeated by Bartlett in the general election 66% to 34%. In 1966 Crawford easily won the

Democratic nomination with 54% over Don Allensworth, David Osmundon, and David Koontz, who was elected to the Frederick City Board of Aldermen in 2005. Steve ran a spirited campaign, opened a campaign office in Frederick on Patrick Street and generated a lot of enthusiasm. Unfortunately, he lost to Bartlett 57% to 43%. Until Bartlett was defeated by John Delaney in 2012 after the redistricting made the district much more favorable for a Democratic candidate, Crawford received the highest percentage vote against Bartlett in Bartlett's nine re-election campaigns.

Steve was elected president of the United Democrats of Frederick County in 1998 and served a two- year term. In 2000 Frederick held its first elected nonpartisan Board of Education elections. Crawford entered the primary election and proceeded to the general election along with Norine Haas, Ron Peppe, Linda Nayor, John Ashbury, and Tim Gallagher. The Frederick County Teachers Association endorsed Crawford, Haas and Peppe. In the general election, Crawford, Peppe, and Navor became the first elected Board of Election members in Frederick County. On November 20, 2002 Steve Crawford resigned from the Board of Election due to the fact that his new job at the National Governor's Association required extensive traveling.

Steve Crawford spent three years in the U.S. Army as a training officer in the Airborne School and was an infantry officer during the Vietnam War, receiving a Bronze Star. In addition to teaching at Bates College, The University of Maryland College

Park, and The George Washington University, Steve worked at the Brookings Institution, the National Governors Association, The National Policy Association, the State of Maryland Governors Workforce Investment Board, the Albert Einstein Institute, and the Bureau of Applied Social Research. He was the author of many publications and was a true blend of the academic and the political.

In September we lost Carol L. Gill. Carol was the wife of former Democratic State Central Committee member, Tom Gill. She was 81. She taught elementary school and special education. In 2004 she and Tom moved to Frederick to be near their grandchildren. She was an artist and a member of the Frederick Arts Council, the Frederick Woman's Civic Club, the Frederick Torch Club, and Saint Katherine Drexel Parish. Our condolences go to her family and friends.

We are about six weeks away from the 2024 legislative session. I am looking forward to it as the current interim has afforded far more opportunity for preparation time than during an election year.

I recently had a very productive meeting with the Senate President. He verified that the major issues of the session are likely to be:

- Equitable transportation access and sustainable funding
- Workforce development
- Climate and energy de-
- carbonization
- Public safety
- Education blueprint implementation
- Housing

Many of the bills that I have submitted to drafting, fall under these topics.
